

## Argumentative Critique Peer Review Questions

### Introduction

- Underline the thesis/ main argument of both the essay and the article being discussed.
- Does the thesis clearly state the writer's position about the article? Does that position address either the validity or credibility of the article?
- Is the introduction the right length for the paper?
- Is there a title and does it fit the paper?

### Body Paragraphs

- How many body paragraphs are there?
- Underline each of the topic and concluding sentences.
- Do the topic and concluding sentences relate directly back to the subtopics that were expressed/suggested in the thesis?
- Do the body paragraphs deviate from the plan laid out by the thesis either through the addition of other subtopics or the subtraction of existing subtopics?
- Are there any places where the writer does too much summary and not enough analysis? (feel free to mark this on the essay)

### Conclusion

- Is there a conclusion paragraph?
- Does it restate the thesis with a difference in the first sentence?
- Does the last sentence take the topic out a broader level? (i.e. re-address the "what's the point question?")
- Is the conclusion the right length?

## **In General**

- Is the paper totally in the right format (APA or MLA)? If not, what is incorrect?
- Is the paper the right length?
- Does the paper make a convincing argument?
- Does the writer define the terms of her/his argument? (what she/he agrees with and/or disagrees with in the article)
- Does the writer address the “what’s the point?” question in both the introduction and the conclusion?
- Are there some parts of the paper that seem unnecessary?
- Are there some things that the paper ought to have addressed?
- Does the writer follow my essay advice?
